





THE LANGUAGE OF TRAUMA

Trauma can impact the way adopted children perceive the world and how they interpret words and conversations. This often creates a severe disconnect between adoptive parents and their adopted children. In this keynote, Heather will discuss and demonstrate how what we say and how we deliver our communication often gets wildly misinterpreted by children who have been impacted by negative life experiences. Learning to "speak trauma" can make the difference in how trust can be built and how well adoptive parents are able to create emotional safety with their adopted children. In turn. this becomes the building block for decreasing unsafe behaviors in the home. Join Heather for this authentic and relatable keynote. EQUIPPING TRANSRACIAL ADOPTIVE PARENTS TO CULTIVATE POSITIVE RACIAL IDENTITY

Elizabeth Dobson, MA and Jenna L. Jebitsch, PsyD, LPC

This workshop is focused on strategies to equip transracial adoptive parents to raise their children with confidence in their racial identity and with an emotionally healthy sense of self. The value of fostering a child's emotional and psychological needs as it relates to their racial identity will be addressed along with strategies at the organizational level that should be considered to support these families. The concepts shared are based on research, Liz Dobson's personal experience as an adoptee of color raised in an all-white family, and Dr. Jenna Jebitsch's years of clinical experience as a child and family therapist.

Post-placement care is critical for birth parents, not only to provide them the resources they need to heal, but because birth parents who struggle with unresolved or ambiguous grief and trauma carry that burden into the relationships they navigate going forward as part of their open adoption plans, impacting both adoptive parents and adoptees. We discuss what optimal care can look like for birth parents, why caring for birth parents needs to be built into every adoption, how that care (or lack thereof) affects adoptive parenting practices, and how providing sustained ongoing care to birth parents is a critical piece in ethical adoption.

Loss is a significant trauma that is too often unspoken or minimized to youth. And yet, for children to make new attachments, they must be supported in grieving lost and broken attachments. 
SUPPORTING ADOPTEES IN EARLY ADULTHOOD



RUPTURES AND REPAIRS: ADDRESSING ATTACHMENT PATTERNS IN CAREGIVERS

Examining and addressing caregiver attachments patterns can be even more important than addressing children's difficult behaviors. Even minor attachment disruptions can have a tremendous impact on how one parents a foster/adoptive child. This presentation will provide strategies for supporting caregivers as they reflect on their own experience, and steps caregivers can take to heal their own attachment histories and be more fully attuned to their foster/adopted children.
